Two current brothers help out with the bird toy making recruitment event.

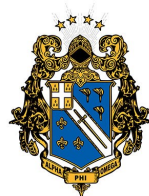
Welcome Pledges!

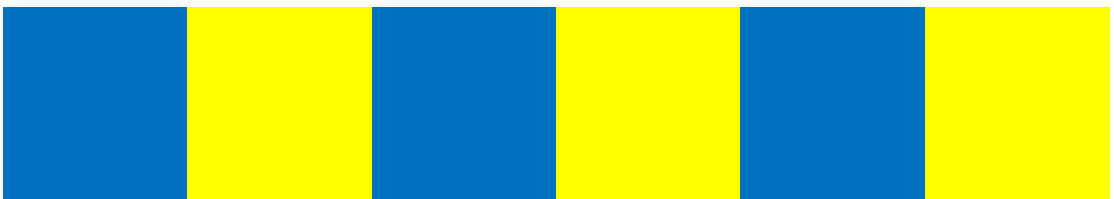
Three brothers show off the tray of ravioli that they made.

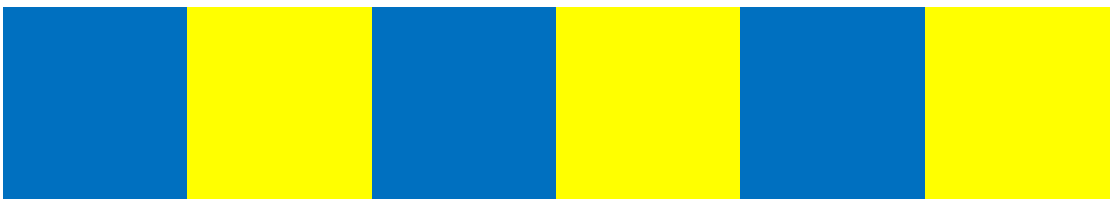
What APO means to Danielle :

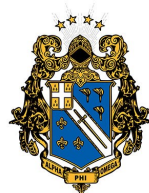


Relay for Life: Team APO
